April Meeting on "Cosmic Evolution"

In an excellent and wide ranging talk full of stunning images Mike Whybray not only took us through the evolution of the universe but delved into the physical processes - from quantum physics to supernovae - that created the elements that led to planets and life itself. Moving from there he explored and speculated upon some of greatest mysteries that remain. Not least of these is the problem of 'dark matter', a hypothetical form of matter that is thought to form about 85% of the matter content of the universe but which is effectively invisible,

and 'dark energy' - which appears to be causing the expansion of the universe to accelerate in an unexpected way. Needless to say there were lots of questions throughout and afterwards.

Religion and the Beeb?

According to the television commissioning editor responsible for religious output the BBC is poised to place more religious characters in EastEnders and primetime drama series.

Other moves include plans for religious topics to be included in travel shows and cooking formats as the corporation seeks to make its faith-based programming more accessible to mainstream audiences.

This has been highlighted as part of a drive (as *The Times* put it) to present belief in a more "subtle and pleasurable" way.
